APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A Motion was made by Mr. DeVantier seconded by Mr. McRell to approve the minutes from the March 7th, 2024 board meeting

LL1 - 2024 Public Hearing

- -This aforesaid local law imposes adds language to paragraph B of section 180-23 of the Code of the Town of Rockland, entitled Water Service, authorizing the Town Board to establish by resolution from time-to-time a charge for each occasion on which, upon request of the Town, a consumer does not give access to a premises upon which a water meter is intalled for the purpose of allowing the Town to inspect such water meter.
- -Motion to open public hearing at 7:05 PM made by Mrs. Routledge and seconded by Mr. McRell
- -Supervisor Eggleton began public hearing with asking for comments from the public
- -Sheila Shultz asked why this law is being put in place? Supervisor Eggleton responded with many people have not allowed us into their homes to have these placed and it is mandatory that we do so
- -Donna Bowers asked if it costs money to have them replaced? Supervisor Eggleton responded that the Town pays for all the meter heads they just need to have permission to enter home to swap them out for the old ones.
- -Sheila Shultz asked what the price will be if people don't let the Town change out the meters and she also asked if the people who are bypassing the meters (stealing water from the town) going to be charged as well? Supervisor Eggleton responded that the board has not come out with the exact amount of what the penalty will be, however, it needs to be enough for the residents to allow us in the residents, and for those who have bypassed the meters they are violating a law and will be charged as well.

A motion was made by Mr. DeVantier and seconded by Mr. McRell to close public hearing at 7:12 PM

Condemnation of Willowemoc Motel Public Hearing

- -A motion was made by Mr. McRell and seconded by Mrs. Routledge to appoint Mr. DeVantier as a hearing officer for the unsafe building (26.-1-8; 106 Debruce Road)
- -Hearing began with Code Enforcement Officer, Glenn Gabbard, showing a presentation to the Town Board and the public of the conditions of the Willowemoc Motel, which is dilapidated, vandalized and has extreme flood damage from previous floods in the surrounding area. He explains that in order for this structure to be viable again, it must be elevated 2 FT to the legal flood plain elevation level according to NYS standards and the standards of the Town of Rockland's code
- -Supervisor Eggleton asked if there is anyone from the current property owner or someone that has interest in this motel
- -Richard Baun, representing Santorini Beach Motel, mortgage holder spoke.. Hearing notice was served on my client and when I spoke with Attorney Ken Klein I asked if we could preserve the structure and defer the decision to tear the building down. If there would be some specific suggestions that the Town could allow us to secure the building before taking it down. We could foreclose or sell but in the mean time, if you would allow to secure the structure before deciding to tear it down. Some inquiries about purchasing this property have been made, however, we have limited options because we only hold a mortgage. We would ask for 30 days to make it safe in the short term, that will certainly be enough time to make this structure safe.

- -Ken Klein says the process for the Town would be that the hearing officer makes finding and recommends them to the board and then the board needs to ratify them before taking any further action. Richard, if you can get a commitment from your client to one of the options Mr. Gabbard has presented that would put the board in a position to respond to your request.
- -Sheila Shultz asked if the taxes have been paid and if it does get rehabilitated is there any grand fathering protection in regards to the flood plain?
- -Supervisor Eggleton says the taxes have been delinquent for 2 years now and there are no grand fathering protection, they would have to elevate the building in order to meet the standards and get it up to code.
- -Donna Bowers says there are so many other buildings in the Town of Rockland that are in bad shape

A motion was made by Mr. McRell and seconded by Mrs. Routledge to close the condemnation hearing at 7:29 PM
